Downtown School Calendar

I want to thank our parents, staff and community members who have, and continue to, lobby for various school-related legislation.

The calendar debate ended with the passing of HF 227 and Governor Branstad's signing of the bill on April 10. This legislation mandates that schools may not start classes before August 23. Although we received word that our waiver request to begin school before August 23 was denied, that is not the end of the story.

HF 227 also has an exemption for year round schools. With this exemption, there are strict guidelines for determining the criteria that constitute a year round calendar. The main guideline is that schools may not have breaks any longer than 6 consecutive weeks. Since our original proposed calendar (the one shared with parents during conferences in February) had about a $7\frac{1}{2}$ week summer vacation, it did not meet those new guidelines. To comply with the new guidelines, we have revised the original calendar by lengthening the calendar 9 days and taking 9 additional days off throughout the school year.

I met with district officials after school on Friday. It was determined that we will submit a revised calendar, with the new requirements, with an application for the year round exemption. That proposal will go to our school board for a public hearing on Tuesday, May 5. The deadline for the application to the Department of Education is Monday, May 11.

I will send a revised calendar to parents, as soon as we receive final approval.

Thank you for your patience. I apologize for the delays and confusion with this calendar issue. The most important outcome is doing what is best for our children!
