Classrooms kick off new units of study!

Kindergarten students will explore the big idea that all living things in the natural world have needs in order to survive and grow. Through a close study of trees and the living things that depend on them, students will take on the roles of researcher and scientist to make observations of the natural world.

First Grade flies into the world of birds! Students will build their literacy skills as they engage in an in-depth study of birds' bodies. They will focus on the big ideas that animals have physical features to help them survive, and animals behave in ways to help them survive.

Second Grade students will build their research skills and science knowledge through a study of the secret world of plants and pollinators.

Third Grade students will consider what can be learned from reading literary classics. In this module, students will consider the answer to this question through a case study of Peter Pan.

Fourth Grade students will explore how perspective can influence opinion through the lens of the American Revolution. By reading informational texts and historical fiction, students will deepen their understanding of the Patriot and Loyalist perspectives.

Fifth Grade students will consider the factors that contribute to the success of professional athletes as leaders of social change. They will read about a number of professional athletes who have been leaders of social change, beginning with Jackie Robinson.
